

We have taken multiple steps to make sure your grades reflect your performance.

Teachers have received clear guidance and support with grading and making objective decisions to enable grades to be fair.

There is also a rigorous system to ensure fairness, including checks in school and by examboards.

If a student thinks an error has been made in their grade, an appeals system is in place as a safety net for exceptional circumstances, and to fix any genuine errors that were not identified earlier in the process.

If you think a grade is incorrect when you receive your results, you can appeal if you think:

- 1. there has been an administrative error
- 2. the school did **not apply a procedure** correctly
- 3. that there was an **unreasonable exercise of academic judgement** in the choice of evidence from which your grade was determined

You should **consider carefully if appealing is the right course of action for you**. Be aware that on appeal, **grades could go up, down, or stay the same** and the exam board's decision will be final. Once a finding has been made you cannot withdraw your request for a centre review or appeal. If your grade has been lowered, you will not be able to revert to the original grade you received on results day.

The exam boards will not be able to consider appeals that are based solely on differences of opinion. If you want to improve your grade you might want to consider entering for the autumn exam series.

There are priority and non-priority appeal routes. Priority appeals are only for students applying to higher education who did not attain their firm choice (i.e. the offer they accepted as their first choice) and wish to appeal an A level or other Level 3 qualification result. All other appeals must follow the non -priority route.

You should submit a request for a centre review by 12 August 2021 for a priority appeal, or by 2 September 2021 for non-priority appeals.

To appeal you should submit a **request for** a **centre review**

If upon receipt of the appeal outcome, you believe the exam board has made a procedural error in handling your appeal,



APPEAL STAGE ONE:

Your grade will be checked for any administrative or procedural errors:

- an error in the way the teacher assessed grade (TAG) was calculated or submitted
- · the centre did not follow its procedure properly and consistently
- · a reasonable adjustment / access arrangement was not provided
- the exam board made a mistake when assigning or communicating a grade a grade

Your grade will be reviewed by at the awarding body. It will consider:

GROUNDS FOR APPEAL?

- whether the original Teacher Assessed Grade decision was reasonable on its own terms, not if any alternative proposition for the Teacher Assessed Grade or evidence put forward by the student, would be a more appropriate exercise of academic judgement. There may be a difference of opinion as to the assessed grade without there being an unreasonable exercise of academic judgement. The reviewer will only conclude that there has been an unreasonable exercise of academic judgement if the Teacher Assessed Grade was clearly wrong
- · whether an academic decision to depart from, or not to depart from, the starting point of same evidence in respect of the particular student was unreasonable

NB: The fact that an appeal has been up-
