Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith

An acceptance that other people having different faiths or beliefs to oneself (or having none) should be accepted and tolerated, and should not be the cause of prejudicial or discriminatory behaviour.

- International visits: Paris trip- encouraging students to appreciate and respect their own and other cultures.
- **Triple-E** e.g. Samba band, Multilingualism, Japanese. Enhancing student understanding of their place in a culturally diverse society and by giving students opportunities to experience such diversity.
- Educational visitors: Holocaust survivor, representatives of religious faiths.
- Awareness of other faiths: Through explicit RE teaching in KS3 and visiting speakers in KS4.
